World experts on tooth whitening come to Glasgow

On Friday 2 December 2011 FGDP(UK) Scotland will welcome two of the world's leading experts on tooth whitening to Glasgow: Professor Van B Haywood (Augusta, Georgia) and Dr Linda Greenwall (London). Their presentations will describe the latest tooth whitening techniques and explain how these are relevant to all patients, from the youngest to the oldest.

Dr Linda Greenwall is an authority on tooth whitening and aesthetic dentistry, and a specialist in restorative dentistry and prosthodontics. She is an honorary clinical teacher at King's College London Dental Institute.

Van B Haywood DMD is Professor in the Department of Oral Rehabilitation, School of Dentistry, Georgia Health Sciences University. In 1989 he co-authored the first publication in the world on nightguard vital bleaching (at-home bleaching) with Dr Harald Heymann, and in 1997 he co-authored the first article on extended treatment (six months) of tetracycline-stained teeth using this technique.

For the second year running, the study day will take place at Glasgow Science Centre, and during the day Professor Van Haywood and Dr Linda Greenwall will deliver a six-hour programme of presentations in the IMAX Theatre. This will cover a wide range of key topics including: legal aspects of bleaching; patients' and clinicians' expectations; and the scientific basis

of modern bleaching. It will also look at home bleaching; power bleaching; bleaching of teeth affected by fluorosis; treating tetracycline discolouration; and building your practice through bleaching. A CPDA allowance of six hours will be applied for.

In addition to the main presentation, the day will feature an extensive trade show, high-quality catering and an evening drinks reception.
